


YEAR 5 SCIENCE WORKSHOPS

Year 5 were very excited to visit Harrogate Grammar School on Wednesday morning for 2 wonderful science workshops. In workshop 1 (and after having a safety talk) we practised lighting matches carefully. Then we made a convection spiral using a paper plate and tealight candle. The science of convection currents was explained afterwards; it was certainly a 'wow' moment! In workshop 2, we learnt about indicators; what items were acids and alkaline. Using a variety of scientific equipment, we looked at the pH scale and used red cabbage to filter the mixture and then used lemon juice and sodium carbonate to test the indicator liquid. A huge thank you to the HGS staff: Dr Sutcliffe, Mrs Murgatroyd and Mr Sykes, for a fabulous morning!




