

## PICTURE BOOK ASSEMBLY



On Wednesday this week, Mrs Bridge read 'You're So Amazing' written by James and Lucy Catchpole and illustrated by Karen George. This story links well to 'International Day of People with Disabilities' which was on Wednesday.

The synopsis on Waterstones website ([www.waterstones.com](http://www.waterstones.com)) states the following about the book: Winner of the Inclusive Books for Children Picture Book Award 2024, shortlisted for the UKLA Book Awards and the LITTLE REBELS Book Award. A funny, whip-smart, friendly picture book that asks readers to imagine how othering it would feel if strangers believed they had to compensate for a person's disability with every interaction.

When people meet Joe, they often treat him as Amazing Joe or Poor Joe. But can't he just be . . . Joe?

One-legged Joe is 'amazing'. He knows this because wherever he goes people always tell him he's amazing. Amazing for sliding down the slide, for kicking a ball . . . even walking to get an ice cream, or even just eating an ice cream. Of course, being Amazing Joe is better than being Poor Joe . . .

## Y5 VISIT TO TRINITY METHODIST CHURCH

On Monday, Year 5 were invited to Trinity Church, Harrogate, to take part in a Christmas Escape Room experience. They became time travellers, going back to the birth of Jesus and the time of the Romans (a perfect link to their current Theme work).

In the first room, the children were asked to find numbers from clues within a story about Caesar Augustus to unlock padlocks and gain important jigsaw puzzle pieces. The boys and girls were even given a Census sheet to complete for their own household after learning about Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.

In room 2, they made a pipe cleaner angel to hang on the tree in church (which can be collected after the church service on 21st December)

Finally, in room 3 they were asked to think about stars who guided the wise men and shepherds to Jesus' stable. We learnt the names of some constellations and specifically the importance of the North Star.

Everyone enjoyed the sessions, and the children were highly commended by Rev Ben Askew for their behaviour and attitude towards each task. Well done, Year 5!
