Welcome back and Happy New Year! I do hope you had a good festive season.

It has been so lovely to welcome the children, and you, back to school this week. I noticed that there were even some children skipping into school on Tuesday morning; I also noticed relief on some parents/carers faces!

On Tuesday, in assembly, I recapped our school rules with the children: RRS (Ready, Respectful and Safe) and our Golden Rule 'Treat others the way you would want to be treated.' The children remembered these brilliantly and were certainly very respectful when coming into and leaving the hall.

Miss Woodcock recapped some of our work from last half term relating to 'One Life', including stopping and catching our emotions before they spiral out of control. Miss Woodcock also introduced this week's focus to the children, which is resilience.



## **INCLEMENT WEATHER – SNOW!**

You may have seen that snow is forecast – possibly for this evening and tomorrow morning, as well as over the weekend into Monday.

As always, bad weather and snow in particular tend to cause disruption on the roads and safety can be compromised for all. The roads and pathways can be treacherous to navigate in the morning for staff, parents and children alike and if we are open, you should travel to school if it is safe for you to do so. Staff will, of course, make their best efforts to get to work however, we do have several staff who live a considerable distance from school, who may struggle to get to work in the case of significant snowfall.

Currently, the forecast is changeable, and you should presume that school is open, unless you hear differently from us. Please do not telephone the school to ask if we are open/closed as we will need our phone lines available for staff to contact school if they are having difficulties in getting to work.

Please visit our website where we will endeavour to put a message as to whether the school is closed.

Should we need to close school, I will strive to inform you by 7.30am, however sometimes circumstances prevent this, so your patience and understanding would be appreciated.

If we do need to close the school, please visit our school website first, however we will also attempt to inform you in the other following ways:

- We will send an email message to parents using Arbor (as long as this service is working).
- A message will also be placed on Whole School Dojo and Tapestry.

If the weather is particularly inclement and we do need to close, then as we do not experience snow that often in the UK, I would like the children to be able to enjoy their snow day. Some ideas for what the children could do are:

- Make a snow animal and take a photo. Send the photo into the school office. Please only do this if you are giving permission for the photo to be used in our newsletter and on our school social media pages. I wonder how many different animals we can make!
- Snow angels
- Sledging
- Build an igloo
- Help parents/carers/neighbours to clear paths with permission and under supervision.
- Make a snow person or snow monster.

Closing the school is a last resort and we do so to keep everyone safe. I'm hoping that any snowfall will be small and that we can operate as usual, but it's best to be prepared.

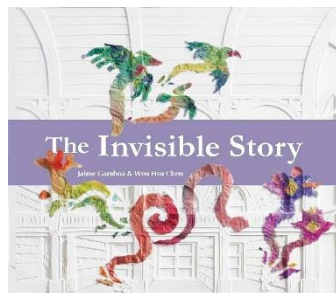
