

NAEA STUDY VISIT 2025 – CHINESE DELEGATES VISIT ROSSETT ACRE

On Wednesday, we were delighted to host 29 Chinese Principals/Vice Principals from 21 different schools across China as part of a six-day inquiry programme across the UK, which is designed to support the visiting Principals in deepening their understanding of leadership development, inclusive education and STEAM education (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics).

Mrs Ingle and Miss Bland did an amazing job of explaining our well-being/nurture provision, delivering a presentation and showing the delegates our Nurture Rooms and other areas of our school. Sharing good practice is so important and it was a privilege to welcome the visitors to our school.


CELEBRATION ASSEMBLY

Two of our Year 5 pupils, Joe and Edith, proudly represented our school at a special event celebrating the retirement of Red Kite's CEO, Mr Sheriff. Joe performed a wonderful musical performance, playing the Beatles *"In My Life"* on the guitar, which was warmly received by everyone present. Edith showcased her creativity by producing a beautifully personalised *Little People, Big Dreams* style illustrated book, capturing the life story and remarkable

achievements of Mr Sheriff throughout his career. Both pupils were a real credit to the school, demonstrating talent, thoughtfulness and confidence on this memorable occasion.

ENERGY HEROES

On Monday, Susan Abbott from Energy Heroes visited our school to carry out an energy survey with eight children from Eco-committee. I had the great pleasure of joining the group too. The children were great ambassadors for our school, behaving excellently whilst happily carrying out a range of tasks eg. checking if windows and doors in school were double-glazed, if radiator thermostats worked and looking at how full fridges were. (The children found out that full fridges use less energy than emptier ones.) The children visited our Boiler Room to look at how pipes are insulated and discussion took place about a range of issues: Global Warming, Fossil Fuels, Methane from animals (eat less meat), insulation in walls/ceiling and recycling.

The children learned that we already do lots to be sustainable in school e.g. recycling card/paper, recycling batteries, collecting and recycling food waste, making compost for our Gardening Club to use, reducing energy costs by turning off lights and projectors when not in the room, solar panels and LED lights fitted across school. However, there is more to be done. Susan and the children created an action plan, that once implemented would help us to use less energy in school and have a positive impact on our planet.

The action plan has been given to Miss Kirkwood who leads 'Sustainability' in school and our Eco-committee will be looking at how to action the points raised.
