On Monday, Miss Woodcock led an assembly linked to Children's Mental Health Week. The focus was belonging, being part of a community, inclusion and keeping each other safe.



On Tuesday, Richard Sheriff, CEO visited school for a final farewell tour, speaking to colleagues and children. It was lovely to see Richard and for him to reminisce about his time in our school, over the years, and his time at Harrogate Grammar as Headteacher, which was Richard's role when I joined Rossett Acre as Headteacher in January 2007. The inauguration of Red Kite Learning Trust, all the wonderful things that have been achieved, the collaborative approach and the fantastic learning opportunities that have been afforded to children across our Trust.

The children made me laugh as we moved around school as Richard's height seemed to be the running commentary from them as he entered each classroom; it reminded me of the time, many years ago, when Richard visited our school to lead an assembly and managed to walk straight into the arm of the projector which was hanging down from the ceiling and almost knocked himself out! Ever the professional, he carried on regardless, however, he did tell me later that the children were swaying in front of his eyes despite them being sat down and still! Although the projector arm did not pose a problem for anyone else in school, the projector now sits very close to the ceiling, so even Mr Sheriff's height no longer poses a problem.

On Friday lunchtime last week, 59 pupils (Y3 – Y6) and 7 adults all got on a coach with the destination being Utilita Arena, Sheffield. On arrival, we found our seats, right at the front this year, which meant we could see the stage brilliantly, and began an afternoon of rehearsals, which was lots of fun. After tea and numerous visits to the toilet, which involved very long queues, we settled down to the evening's performance. A few of the children were a little nervous and slightly overwhelmed but once the show began, everyone was smiling and enjoying the experience. Singing Squad made up part of a 5,086 strong choir of children at the Arena and sounded amazing! There were star guest singers and Andy and the Urban Striders (Dance troop) received huge praise from all the children in the Arena – it was loud! We loved joining in with the dances – both children and adults.

We were incredibly proud of all the children at the Arena but especially our Rossett Acre children who were fantastic ambassadors for our school and participated brilliantly.

This is an experience that the children are unlikely to forget, and we all thoroughly enjoyed ourselves. We arrived back at school just after 10.30pm, so it was a late night for the children and staff!

A huge thank you to Mrs Tinfina, Miss Smith, Mrs Illingworth, Miss Bolton, Miss Pearson and Mrs Stott who all supervised the children with me and gave up their own time to ensure the children had a magical day.

A special thank you and mention to Mrs Stott who organised our participation in the event and has been teaching the children the songs, sorting out t-shirts, torches and all sorts of things.

CSI DAY

Spring has been an exciting and action-packed time for Year 6 at Rossett Acre. When the children returned from their Christmas break, they were amazed to find their classroom transformed into a Spy Academy. They tackled a series of mathematical spy missions and even designed their own Alex Rider-style gadgets, creating adverts to promote them to trainee espionage agents.

The highlight of the term was a visit from Sci-High for a CSI Whodunit event, led by forensic scientist Jon Bates. Dressed in full SOCO outfits, the children examined a wide range of evidence to solve an aggravated burglary case. Their investigations included analysing fingerprints, testing "blood" samples found on suspects' clothing, using chromatography to identify the author of threatening messages, comparing handwriting samples, reconstructing shattered headlamps, and spotting patterns in DNA evidence. By carefully evaluating each clue, they were able to eliminate suspects and narrow down the culprit. A last-minute discovery of police text messages added a dramatic twist, leading to a courtroom finale in which a judge questioned the suspects and the jury delivered the final verdict.

The Year 5s had an exciting time competing in the football tournament at Rossett High School on Tuesday evening where they displayed excellent teamwork and determination throughout every match. Each player supported their teammates, communicated well on the field and gave their best effort against some strong competition. 
ENERGY SPARKS VISIT AND ASSEMBLIES

On Wednesday, the Eco Committee took part in a workshop with James from Energy Sparks. This is a platform used by the Eco Committee in school to check and assess the school's gas and electricity consumption. We can also check how our solar panels are working and how they are saving money. We looked at James's portable solar panel and how this worked giving us a greater understanding of how our own solar panels work in school.

Finally, as a group we used the heat camera to establish when our school building was producing heat and losing heat. We were amazed to see our handprints still on the wall when we removed them, and even a few bottom marks on chairs when we stood up!

Before James departed, he held a KS1 assembly where they got to look at the solar panel and then a KS2 assembly. In this assembly James told us all about his expedition to the South Pole and how his experiences have been his motivation to help with climate change.

The Eco Committee are now even more inspired to help with climate change and decrease our carbon footprint.
