Lost days create gaps in learning

Did you know absenteeism during a pupil's primary school years is associated with a pattern of lower academic achievement in numeracy and literacy, which can leave them struggling at senior school.

Did you Know... Missing just one or two days every few weeks can make it much harder to:
Gain valuable reading and Maths skills, develop and maintain good friendships, establish positive attendance habits.
The educational, attendance and friendship skills your child develops during their primary years helps them build a resilience that will last a lifetime.



Establishing good attendance habits helps your child feel positive about both their learning and themselves. Starting to build these habits from the first day of their school journey is an important part in supporting their love of lifelong learning that will help them succeed!

What can you do?

Support your child to have a positive attitude about attendance.

Talk about it! Sing about it! Make it a game! Create an adventure!

Set regular calm, relaxed family bedtime and morning routines.

Choose and lay out school clothes and pack bags the night before.

Share ideas with other parents for getting to school on time.

Keep up to date with school events so your child is always prepared.

Organise appointments outside of school time wherever possible.

Seek the teacher's support if your child seems anxious about school.

Help your child be a successful learner! Support a high attendance level!

Every day your child is not at school it must be officially recorded as two sessions absent, and if persistent this can lead to you, as their parent, being fined for poor attendance.
