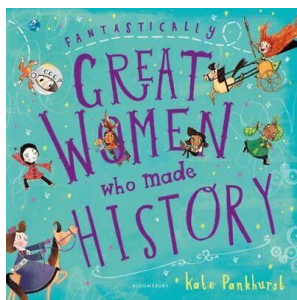

Welcome back, everyone. I hope you had a lovely half term break.

On Monday in assembly, I reminded our children about the school rules: RRS (Ready, Respectful, Safe) and our Golden Rule 'Treat others the way you would want to be treated.' The children remembered the rules well and could give me examples of what 'Ready, Respectful and Safe' look like in our school. After this, we did an activity linked to meditation and the Zones of Regulation. Ozzy the Owl showed the children how to slow down their breathing and use it as a support tool if they become angry, anxious or just want to feel calm and relaxed. The children practised their breathing and those asked said it had helped them to feel calm. The soothing meditation music of a babbling brook that was playing on the way in and out of assembly also helped with this.

On Wednesday, Mrs Ingle read from the book 'Fantastically Great Women who made History' by Kate Pankhurst. Mrs Ingle told the children about Dr Elizabeth Blackwell, a British and American Physician, who was the first woman to ever be awarded a medical degree.
