

Eco Committee's Weekly Top Tip: Use energy saving light bulbs

YEAR 6 YOUTH BOARD PUPIL VOICE

Two of our year 6 children, Harry M and Charlotte H who are part of the Trust's Youth Board, met with Mrs Macnair this week to discuss what the school, and the Trust, are doing towards sustainability. They discussed our energy saving efforts by switching lights off when not in use, as well as moving to a new waste company who guarantee that our waste will not just go straight to landfill; we are recycling our food and we have recycling bins in each classroom; our younger children no longer have milk cartons, but instead have their milk from washable cups; we have had LED lighting installed throughout school; we are due to have solar panelling installed in school before the end of April; we have a new more energy efficient boiler and smart meters; our catering company only use local produce; we are starting to buy collaborately with other Trust schools and the staff use their lanyards to release any printing so jobs are not duplicated. Both Harry and Charlotte were very passionate about the subject and will attend a Trust Youth Board meeting with other children from throughout the Trust on 13th March, after which they will feed back to Mrs Macnair any other sustainability ideas we can introduce in our school.


