What a busy week we have had. I started the week off with an assembly linked to road safety, particularly the use of mobile phones when walking near to/crossing roads and the importance of 'looking up' and being aware of your surroundings to keep yourself safe. The children were great at answering my questions and we even looked at some footage of 'smart crossings' being trialled in other countries.

I also informed the children that myself and other HT's in Harrogate have been working with Oatlands & Pannal Ash Road Safety & Active Travel Campaign, which includes a parent from our school, Jenny Marks, campaigning for 20mph zones to be in place around schools and generally to make our streets safer. It is so important that we keep our children safe, particularly when coming to, and going home from school.



The Road Safety School Group met again this week at Rossett School to discuss progress to date. A presentation from North Yorkshire Council officers on the plan for delivering 20mph in South and West Harrogate was also given. See the article below for details.

We are again taking part in the Walk to School Day initiative and this time BBC Radio York are going to be in attendance at the school gates on Richmond Avenue at the start of the school day. They will be meeting with Fiona Jones (parent and organiser) and John the School crossing patrol at 8.20am before walking down to our school gates.

Get active whilst helping combat climate change! Can you leave the car at home for most, if not all, of the school run on Friday 20th October.

49% of our district's carbon emissions come from transport, which makes it the largest contributor to our district's carbon footprint. It's also 28% above the UK average! By choosing a more sustainable form of transport, you can do your bit to help protect our communities and our planet by tackling climate change. Even if you live too far from school to walk or cycle all the way, there are other options such as public transport, car sharing or 'park and stride' – this is where you park sooner than normal and walk the last part. All these options will help lower our carbon footprint. Every mile counts!

The physical and mental health benefits of exercise are well known, with studies also showing that walking to school improves concentration and helps students arrive ready to learn. Making the journey on foot, by bike or using public transport means fewer vehicles on the road, benefitting the wider community with less traffic and cleaner air.

Assisting parental understanding of autism, communication and sensory needs.

Who is it for

Unlocking Autism is a free course for parents and carers of children and young people with communication and interaction needs. You must live in North Yorkshire or your child attend North Yorkshire school or setting to be eligible. Children do not need to have a diagnosis of autism in order for parents to attend.

 The programme includes sessions on behaviour, emotional regulation, Communication, sensory
differences and autism providing practical tools and strategies to support children and young people.

This is an online course which consists of five sessions which either run over two full days or as five, 2 hour webinars. It is recommended that parents/carers complete all five sessions in order to derive maximum benefit from the programme.
