

A COUPLE OF SCHOOL REMINDERS

CHILDREN IN NEED



It was great to see the children coming into school wearing spots last Friday to celebrate Children in Need. Our Bearpee total reached over 24,000. A great effort by all our children and staff, and a big thank you to everyone who sponsored us in order to raise money for Children in Need. Sponsor money and Casual Day donations raised a total of £750.



Last week, I received the following fabulous photo from one of our parents and their child: Oscar and his Mum, Mrs Buckley, have been doing the bearpee challenge, 33 per day. They completed their 1000 bearpees on Children in Need Day last Friday – they even did bearpees on holiday in Turkey over half term! Fantastic! They have raised £520 for Children in Need which is a magnificent total. Well done to them both.

DOES ANYONE HAVE ANY SPARE ROALD DAHL BOOKS OR KENSUKE'S KINGDOM (MICHAEL MORPURGO)?

The Just Read Project involves the teacher reading a challenging text whilst the children follow along in their own copy of the book, using their finger to keep on track. Any tricky vocabulary is pre-taught prior to the session and the teacher reads for 25 minutes. The research has shown that reading in this way, over 12 weeks, can increase reading comprehension by 12 months, 2 years and in some cases, comprehension can increase by 3 years. As such, it is a great project to try. Year 4 and Year 6 currently have 2 class sets of books each which is fantastic. The books have been carefully selected to ensure that they are of the correct level of challenge, using something called a lexile count. The Just Read Project can make so much impact with reading comprehension; however, this is quite expensive to fund.

Therefore, we are trying to put together some class sets of books. If anyone has any books by Roald Dahl, or Michael Morpurgo that they are clearing out, and willing to donate, please can you send them with your child to Mrs Ingle. We would particularly like Kensuke's Kingdom (Michael Morpurgo) and the shorter Roald Dahl books such as: Fantastic Mr Fox, George's Marvellous Medicine, Danny Champion of the World, The Twits, The Giraffe, Pelly and Me, etc.


