


















The Little Red Hen

Errol loves gardening, but he doesn't have a proper garden. Although his home is full of beautiful plants, he longs for an outdoor space where he can grow things. A chance discovery leads to a solution...

Key vocabulary: garden, roof, growing, perfect,

Possible experiences:

drawing, seed sorting.

Oliver's Vegetables

Do you like chips? Oliver does. In fact, he won't eat anything else - until he plays a game with his grandpa. Whatever vegetable Oliver finds in the garden, he must eat. On Monday, he pulls up carrots, on Tuesday, it is spinach...

Key vocabulary:

proudly, crinkly, tangle

Possible experiences:

Making bread, making butter, visiting school hens.

Learning school rules Ready, Respectful, Safe.

Keeping ourselves healthy – healthy eating and oral health.

Developing listening skills for carpet times.

White Rose Maths: Getting to Know

Key times of the day, class routines, where do things belong, positional language, sorting and pattern, principles of counting.

Maths through stories.

Literacy:

Phase 1 Phonics – listening and attention skills, rhyme, alliteration, and rhythm.

Phase 2 Phonics – Introducing the first group of sounds. Learning to say, read and write the sounds. Practising oral blending.

Little Red Hen

Reading and retelling the story using story map and actions.

How can you help at home?

In our first term at school we will spend the first few weeks getting to know your children and completing baseline assessments. This will help us with starting points for learning, and setting new classes for Early Years, which will be done before half-term.
