On Monday, I led a 'No-outsiders' assembly about a yellow penguin which was found on South Georgia Island. Scientists have been debating about why the penguin looks so different with some calling it an albino penguin and others saying it could be an 'ino-bird.'

The photograph was taken by Belgian photographer Yves Adams and he described how the penguin gave him a little show; "swam to shore just in front of us... flicked water off its feathers, walked up the sand and entered a colony of King penguins."















I asked the children to look at the photograph and decide whether they thought the yellow penguin was unhappy; if they felt the other penguins were concerned by the penguin not looking like them; if the yellow penguin was accepted by the other penguins; if they thought the penguin was in more danger from predators than the other penguins and asked the children to explain the reasoning behind their answers. I was very impressed with the children's responses, which were thoughtful and positive. My favourite responses were 'Isn't nature beautiful' and 'the penguin is unique and we are all unique.'


## HARROGATE TOWN SOCIAL ACTION PROJECT - FOOD PARCELS
