She explained that sometimes children can have hidden disabilities that are not obvious from looking at someone and that it is important that we meet the needs of everyone in school. The children listened carefully and were able to answer the questions Mrs Tinfina asked them, showing good understanding.



STEP INTO THE NHS CREATIVE COMPETITION DETAILS

Prizes include NHS goody bags and £50 Amazon vouchers (national winner) and £25 Amazon vouchers (regional winner).

Each child who enters the competition will receive a certificate of participation and 5 house points.
