On Tuesday, we hosted some interviews for Red Kite Initial Teacher Training and it was great to meet and interview some potential teachers of the future.



DENTAL VISIT - TUESDAY 30TH APRIL

Year 4 enjoyed a visit from Coppice View Dental Practice as part of their learning about teeth. The dental nurses talked about how many teeth the children had and how to look after them. They started with a quiz and were impressed with how much the children knew from their learning at school. They answered several questions on snacks and said that there were some snacks that people thought were ok, which weren't quite as good as children thought. When asked which would be the best snacks to have at breaktime, they said it was snacks without sugar (including dried fruit). Some examples of teeth-friendlier snacks were: cheese, breadsticks, carrots, celery, peppers and cucumber.

The children were given a toothbrush, some toothpaste and some vouchers and we would like to thank the dental nurses for coming to visit.

MEASLES

The number of measles cases in England has increased significantly since October 2023 and we have been asked to remind students, staff and parents to protect themselves by ensuring they have had 2 doses of the measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine. It's never too late to catch up. If you are unsure of your vaccination status, please check your child's Red Book or speak to your GP.

As far as I am aware, we have not had any measle cases at Rossett Acre this year, however vaccination is the best way to prevent this highly infectious viral illness that can be very unpleasant and sometimes lead to complications.

MAMA DOREEN'S EMPORIUM SING-A-LONG BRUNCH


I don't usually mention places that I've visited in the newsletter, however, I am going to make an exception this week, as I really think the children would enjoy this event.
