SCHOOL UNIFORM

Can all pupils please wear the correct school uniform to school. This applies to EYFS – Y6.

As a reminder, the following should be worn for PE:

PE kit should be unbranded black or navy shorts, (black or navy joggers/leggings – outdoor PE). House plain t-shirt (blue, green, yellow, red) or alternatively a plain white t-shirt can be worn. Black or dark trainers should be worn too. (No brightly coloured trainers).

A plain blue/black top or hoodie to keep warm, if required for outdoor PE. (Y6 can wear their school hoodie, if they have one.)

Football kits/shirts/fleeces/hoodies should not be worn, except on casual/non-uniform days.

A number of our older children, in particular, have started wearing football shirts/kit to school and this does not follow our uniform policy. If children wear any branded football shirts/kits/tracksuit tops/bottoms to school after half-term, they will be asked to change into spare PE kit that we have in school or if we have none in their size, parents/carers will be contacted and asked to bring in the correct uniform.

We would really appreciate parents/carers co-operation with this.

Design a flower bed for the circular bed near the main entrance to the Valley Gardens.


The theme is 'peace' as this is what we'd like for every generation!
