

INFORMATION FROM OATLANDS & PANNAL ASH ROAD SAFETY & ACTIVE TRAVEL CAMPAIGN

20mph zone around our schools - consultation begun on Green Lane and Pannal Ash Road!

After four years of campaigning for safer streets in our community, we are excited to share that North Yorkshire Council (NYC) has agreed to implement a 20 mph zone around schools in South Harrogate, as shown on the map below. Recent serious road traffic collisions in the area involving young people highlighted the need for this scheme, and calls for action came from parents, schools and local residents. Over 2000 of you signed the petitions in 2021 and 2022 asking for this, and we are delighted that NYC is taking it forward.


The first phase of works will be to resurface Green Lane and Pannal Ash Road and add traffic calming at the same time. This has to happen during school holidays to minimise disruption, and NYC plan to proceed this summer.


Speed cushions will be installed in order to physically slow traffic. They are needed because average speeds on these roads are so high. The cushions are designed to minimise the noise of cars passing over them, they do not damage vehicles and they allow safe passage of bikes and buses, whilst reducing speed.

Consultation on this phase has begun, with letters sent to residents and businesses on Green Lane, Pannal Ash Rd and adjoining roads. If you have received a letter, please take the time to respond positively, so that works can go ahead as soon as possible, and the roads will be safer for children for the start of school in September 2024. NYC will be consulting all affected residents and businesses on the whole scheme in the next few months. Many roads will be signed-only 20, with traffic-calming only on roads where average speeds are 25mph or above.
