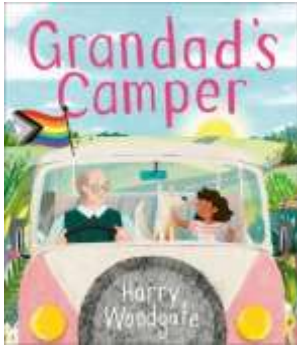
## PARENT SURVEY
