

Last week, we took part in the Great Science Share. It's a chance for children to create questions and find out their own answers through investigating and exploring. The children were so engaged in their learning and really enjoyed sharing their findings with another class. Here are just a few examples of what was being shared in school.

Year 1 did some partner races to investigate if being taller, makes you run faster. They then shared their learning with Year 3.



Year 3 investigated - what can affect how a spinner falls?





Year 4 investigated if arm length affects how far you can throw.



Year 6 were finding out if the tallest children had the biggest feet. They explained their graphs very well to Year 3.


