

### **UNIFORM**

Please ensure that your child wears the correct school uniform each day. In addition to it being our school policy, school uniform also supports the well-being of all our children in school. It plays an important role in promoting a sense of pride and belonging to Rossett Acre and can also increase self-confidence as there is less peer pressure to wear the lastest fashion/sports wear; it also creates equality and fairness for all children regardless of their economic status and prepares them for the expectations of high school.

If your child attends school in non-uniform, please expect a message from your child's class teacher to inform you that the incorrect uniform is being worn and the correct uniform needs to be worn in school.

Black coloured school shoes need to be worn at school. Should you wish for your child to walk to school in different shoes e.g. you feel they are more weather resistant, then this is acceptable, however your child needs to change into their school shoes when they arrive. Trainers should not be worn, except for sports/PE; having a pair of trainers in school each day is essential for your child to play on the Multisports pitch, due to the surface.

No football kit, including shirts should be worn in school unless it is a casual/non-uniform day or your child's teacher has informed you that they can be worn for a class treat day.

# **Universal Infant Free School Meals and the Pupil Premium Grant**

When your child joins our Reception classes, they will automatically be able to have a free school lunch under the government's Universal Infant Free School Meals scheme, which applies to all pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. However, our school may also benefit from additional funding from central government known as the Pupil Premium Grant if your child is entitled to a statutory free school meal for economic reasons.

The level of funding that the school currently receive for 2023/2024 is £1345 for each child who is registered as meeting the statutory free school meal criteria. Our total funding from this at Rossett Acre is relatively low at present, and so it is particularly important that as many families as possible submit their documentation. In order to determine if your child qualifies and to allow us to claim the Pupil Premium funding, it is important that all parents and carers who feel they may meet the criteria below, complete the online form on our website: <a href="https://www.rossettacreprimary.co.uk/for-parentscarers/financial-assistance/">https://www.rossettacreprimary.co.uk/for-parentscarers/financial-assistance/</a>

- Universal Credit, (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400 (£616.67 per month) as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income-Based Jobseekers' Allowance
- Income-Related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are <u>also not entitled to</u> Working Tax Credit and have an annual household gross income that does not exceed £16,190 (as assessed by HMRC)
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

The information provided on the form will be used by the council to check for eligibility to claim additional funding for the school (the 'pupil premium grant') from central government. It will be used for no other purposes and will remain confidential to the council.
