CALLIGRAMS


Thursday 26th September was European day of Languages. Mrs Penhale led an assembly at the start of the week about the event.

Years 2-6 designed their own Calligrams using different symbols for peace. Here is just some of the amazing work the children produced.























EDEN CAMP
