

FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE VISIT

On Thursday, last week, the Fire and Rescue Service visited. They led an assembly for EYFS/KS1 and one for KS2. Kevin explained his role as a firefighter and what it entails; the children asked questions and Kevin asked them questions too. The main focus was about keeping safe and preventing fires from starting in the first place.

The children were given homework from Kevin to ask parents/carers to check their home smoke alarms weekly, and it was suggested that washing machines and dishwashers are not left on overnight which can be a fire hazard.

EYFS and KS1 also spent time with the firefighters and saw the fire engine; the flashing blue lights were particularly enjoyed. This visit also linked fabulously with our Careers Education work and several children thought they might like to be a firefighter in the future. A huge thank you to Kevin and his colleagues for coming in to see us again this year. The children loved it, and it gave us a lot of food for thought!



Y2 VISIT TO PIZZA EXPRESS


OPEN DAY
