The children have experienced the Planetarium where they have travelled to different planets, we have had a visit from Energy Sparks with our Eco-committee using thermal imaging equipment to identify hot and cold spots in school, and I saw EYFS learning about the Moon and how it appears to change shape in the night sky. There has been so much awe and wonder in school, and everyone has thoroughly enjoyed themselves.

Miss Whiteley's class won the award for tidy cloakroom last week – well done!


Mrs Lamb's class won the week previously and Mrs Aslam/Mrs Haslam won in the first week. Super job!


CONGRATULATIONS

The morning began with a whole school assembly which was informative and quite shocking to see how much money it costs to keep school warm and the electricity we use. The next part of the morning was spent with the Eco Committee, and we took part in an Energy Sparks workshop. We looked at our school data in more depth and discussed ways in which we can support our school community in being even more energy efficient. The main event, however, was getting to use the Thermal Camera; we became energy detectives and ventured round school to see where we were losing heat. There was lots of discussion when it came to the staffroom. We are going to be working on some more challenges to increase our score in the school league table - we are currently beating other local Harrogate schools.

If you believe your child is eligible and you have not yet received your voucher, or you have lost it, please contact the school office.




