On Monday, I led an assembly about Anti-littering. The children were great at answering questions relating to the issues linked to littering and were very engaged. I shared some facts with the children e.g. Did you know that plastic bottles can last for about 450 years?! We also discussed how litter can affect our environment, even lowering the price of houses in some areas. We also looked at the impact littering can have on animals and how so many of them can get caught up in/eat litter and become injured or even die.















Great British Spring Clean/Great Big School Clean

Between 21st March – 6th April, Keep Britain Tidy are holding their Great British Spring Clean/Great Big School Clean. Individuals, groups or schools are asked to sign up and pledge to collect a number of bin bags full of litter. We are hoping to take part in this as a school – the majority of children raised their hands when I asked who would be willing to join in with making our environment look better and helping to remove the litter from our streets and countryside. In fact, several children have come to me to ask how they can get involved, which is why I have shared this information with you in advance of the event. Additionally, quite a few children were very concerned with the litter on the beach and how this affects the animals and sea life creatures there, so maybe a trip to the coast at the beginning of the Easter holiday would be a possibility?

It would be great if as many of our families as possible, could be involved and help us to make our surroundings more pleasant and rid the litter that blights it.

There is safety and equipment advice on the link above but please remember to ensure that you and your child/ren are safe whilst litter picking. Strong gloves and litter pickers are a must, and a hi-vis vest is recommended. Remember: Taking part in the Great British Spring Clean is at your own risk, so please only take part if you are willing to take this risk.

You many need to ask permission from the landowner to litter pick if you wish to do so on private land.

I've had a quick look on Amazon and litter pickers can be picked up quite cheaply there; I also believe that Argos and Screwfix may sell them. I know that some councils also support litter picking and have some litter pickers that can be used – I don't know if Harrogate Council does this, but it may be worth asking.

I wonder how many bin bags of litter we can pick up as a school? If every child and adult in school managed to collect one bin bag each through litter picking, we would be able to pledge 475 bags in total. That would be amazing!



Design a flower bed for 2025 depicting '250 years of the USA'

Harrogate in Bloom along with Harrogate Parks Department is promoting a schools' competition for children between the ages of seven and eleven years to design a flower bed, which will be planted in 2026, on the circular bed near the main entrance of the Valley Gardens to promote 'the 250th anniversary of the USA'. The title reinforces the link that the town of Harrogate has enjoyed with Menwith Hill, which is a USA base.

The criteria for the competition is below. A template for the design can be picked up from the school office.

- Please make sure your design is simple but colourful. The bed will be planted in June of the following year. Please bear in mind blue can be a difficult colour to source in flowers.
- Remember to draw simple shapes that our team can recreate using flowering plants.
- Please make sure your name, age, school address and telephone number are clearly written on the back.
- Harrogate Parks Department will be judging the designs and their decision will be final.

The Fund was set up to help people who are struggling with the increase in living costs and feeling the financial pressure of paying their bills. Anyone who has received a letter telling them that they are eligible for a Household Support Fund payment, must select their supermarket e-vouchers by 13 February 2025. Everyone who is eligible will have received a letter by 21 January 2025. Because the guidance has changed, some people who received a payment as part of a previous phase of the Household Support Fund may not this time. The charity re-uses and redistributes good quality used furniture, household items and white goods to residents in need of support. They stock tables, chairs, beds, chest of drawers, cupboards and wardrobes. The also stock appliances including cooers, washing machines, driers, fridges, freezers and small electrical items such as lamps, toasters and kettles. Open to everyone, they run a two-tier price system – anyone in receipt of a means tested benefit or on a low income (less than £21k for an individual or £26k for a couple) can register with them to receive a 35% discount. 
