"Your attitude, not your aptitude, will determine your altitude."

















NO BIG BAGS IN SCHOOL

Please could children refrain from bringing big bags into school. There is no need for them to do so, unless they have Forest School and need to bring a change of clothing. A small bag and their lunchbox (if they have packed lunch)/water bottle is all that is needed. Our cloakrooms are just not big enough for the children to bring big bags to school and they are becoming a danger as bags and coats are falling off the children's pegs (overloaded) and causing a trip hazard whilst children and staff are walking around school. Lunchboxes can be carried and do not need to be inside a big bag. Additionally, some children's bags are laden with keyrings, which again can cause the bags to fall off pegs due to the weight (they are also easy to get caught on people's clothing as they walk past). One keyring is sufficient if your child wishes to display one on their bag – so please ask them to pick their favourite keyring and leave the rest at home.

We'd really appreciate parents/carers help with this. Thank you.

YEAR 4 FINANCE & ENTERPRISE PROJECT

This week it was Y4's enterprise project where they had a range of fair games for example, guess the name of the teddy, guess how many sweets in a jar, guess the weight and where are the chicks hiding on a map? Only take part if you are willing to do so at your own risk and you are completely comfortable with doing so. Please think about the safety aspects of litter picking and choose areas away from traffic, where possible, and don't pick up anything if you consider it to be dangerous - leave it where it is and let the local council know.

We hope you have a wonderful time whilst litter picking. Remember you are making a difference and will be a litter hero! Well done!

I will personally be pledging to collect a bag of rubbish myself and am looking forward to getting out into the fresh air and doing my bit for the planet and my community by litter picking.

Fact - if all children and school staff collected a bag of rubbish each, we could collect close to 500 bags of rubbish – wouldn't that be amazing! If parents/carers also collected a bag of rubbish whilst out litter picking with their children, we could collect even more bags!!

What are the benefits of litter picking?

*Well, it reduces pollution – lots of non-biodegradable materials, such as plastic bottles take hundreds of years to decompose; they can also release toxins into the soil and the environment. *It protects wildlife – many animals every year are hurt and/or killed by being entangled in litter or by injesting it.

*Whole ecosystems can suffer due to litter too.

*We are wasting resources. So many items such as plastic bottles and aluminium cans can be recycled if they are disposed of correctly.




