That way, we can find out exactly how many bin bags of litter we have collected as a whole school community and see the difference we have made as a team.

IMPORTANT

Please be aware that you are responsible for your own safety (and your children's safety) when litter picking - we will not be held responsible for any injuries that may occur.

Only take part if you are willing to do so at your own risk and you are completely comfortable with doing so. Please think about the safety aspects of litter picking and choose areas away from traffic, where possible, and don't pick up anything if you consider it to be dangerous - leave it where it is and let the local council know.

What are the benefits of litter picking?

*Well, it reduces pollution – lots of non-biodegradable materials, such as plastic bottles take hundreds of years to decompose; they can also release toxins into the soil and the environment. *It protects wildlife – many animals every year are hurt and/or killed by being entangled in litter or by ingesting it.

*Whole ecosystems can suffer due to litter too.

*We are wasting resources. So many items such as plastic bottles and aluminium cans can be recycled if they are disposed of correctly.

KS2 BROWNLEE FOUNDATION MINI TRIATHLON - FRIDAY 13 JUNE 2025 - EXPRESSION OF INTEREST

We have been sent information regarding the Brownlee Foundation Mini Triathlon taking place at Harrogate Leisure and Wellbeing Hub (formerly the Hydro). Before we sign up for the event, we are trying to gauge interest and whether it is something we can be involved with.

The event is inclusive, non-competitive and not timed. The event will give **Key Stage 2** pupils an opportunity to try the disciplines of the triathlon. No previous experience or expertise in triathlon is required. Children will swim 3 sides of the pool, cycle 800m on grass and run 300m (all distances are approximate). Bikes and helmets will be provided and every child will receive a t-shirt beforehand and a medal and goody bag when they cross the finish line. For less confident swimmers, a one width swim option is available, remaining in shallow water and scooters are available for children who are unable to ride a bike.

The event will run from 9.30am – 3.00pm and schools who would like to attend will be allocated a timeslot for their children to take part. We will request an afternoon slot to minimise disruption, however each school will be given an arrival time which may not be as we request. Schools will be on site for approximately 1½ hours in total (subject to the number of schools and children participating).

Parents will be required to transport their children to the event and possibly return them to school after the event (depending on the time we are allocated).

Today's attendance is: 96.6%, still good. Well done.




